100 % agree that their children feel safe at school.


98 % feel that their children are making good progress.

Some of you said:




We are not always clear on how we can help our children with their homework

Did you know that we have a school portal and your child has a login so they can access all the homework along with explanations of what to do. We also have a booklet with the Homework guidelines in it which gives parents tips on how to support with homework and this is on the website. Once the policy is agreed we will update the booklet and circulate it again to all families.

Some of you felt:



We could be informed on a more regular basis of how our children are getting on at school.

Assessment at school is ongoing and we then measure children against age related expectations at the end of each term. We share these with you at parents' evenings and in reports at the end of the year. Now that there are no levels we talk to the children about what they can do and what they need to do next (improvements or next steps). Ofsted will look at the children's books to see progress and that is probably the best way for you also to see progress. We have drop in sessions

during the term so that you can come and see the work your children have been doing. We could try and vary these so that they are not always in the morning and then more parents could access them

Some said:

We find it hard accessing newsletters from the I pad

Mrs Agar always prints off a small number of paper copies and you are welcome to get one from the office. Your I pad may have parental controls (very sensible) that block you. Mrs White is always happy to advise you.

There were some other helpful comments:

There could be more awards to encourage children to get better at things.

Could we have a KS1 choir to engage boys in singing?

Could we have more parent sessions on literacy and numeracy as these are really helpful.
