

### Overview of the school

PE has high priority at our school. Studies show that there is a link between children being physically active on a regular basis and progress and achievement.

At Wootton Wawen we ensure that children have regular PE sessions both inside and out as well as other opportunities during the school day to be active. We recognise that not all children like team games so we try to provide as wide a variety of sports as we can and we encourage children to improve their performance in all areas of PE. For those who are more competitive we engage fully in the local sports events supported hugely by willing parent volunteers to transport children.

This report shows how Wootton Wawen CE Primary School is using the grant money provided to develop PE, physical activity and School sport so that it has an impact on children's health and well being in the future as well as helping to raise attainment and achievement.

### Summary of Sports spending 2014/15

#### Objectives in spending Sports Grant:

- To use government funding to improve the teaching and resourcing of PE across the school so that children are achieving at least age related standards in this subject
- To use Government funding to ensure children are developing their health and well being through greater participation in physical activity

- To improve opportunities for children who want to participate in competitive sport
- To develop participation pathways including all pupils that transition into recreational activities

**Summary of spending and actions taken:**

Resources

*To focus on making sure all children are engaged in becoming physically active by providing appropriate resources.*

*To provide good quality resources across a range of sports.*

- A contribution towards the purchase of I pads for the school which can be used in assessing pupils' skills and encouraging children to improve performance and effort.
- Subscription to 5 a day TV

After school clubs for pupils

*To run a variety of clubs led by an experienced coach*

*To support the school sport leaders in organising competitions.*

*Increase pupil participation in school/ local/national school games and competitions*

- Employment of a PE apprentice 5 days a week
- Subscription to NACE –access to resources/ links for Gifted and Talented pupils in sport

Teacher CPD

*Employ specialist coaches to work alongside staff in lessons to increase staff competence and confidence.*

*Training courses*

- Employment of a PE apprentice 5 days a week
- Training courses for staff/ supply cover – main focus gymnastics
- Bought into local coaching infrastructure

Assessment

*To develop an assessment model that will allow children to measure progress and learn how to improve.*

- Purchase of i pads
- PE apprentice to implement, trial and refine assessment model alongside PE co-ordinator
