#### Overview of the school

PE has high priority at our school. Studies show that there is a link between children being physically active on a regular basis and progress and achievement.

At Wootton Wawen we ensure that children have regular PE sessions both inside and out as well as other opportunities during the school day to be active. We recognise that not all children like team games so we try to provide as wide a variety of sports as we can and we encourage children to improve their performance in all areas of PE. For those who are more competitive we engage fully in the local sports events supported hugely by willing parent volunteers to transport children.

This report shows how Wootton Wawen CE Primary School is using the grant money provided to develop PE, physical activity and School sport so that it has an impact on children's health and well being in the future as well as helping to raise attainment and achievement.

## Summary of Sports spending 2015/16

### Objectives in spending Sports Grant:

- To use government funding to improve the teaching and resourcing of PE across the school so that children are achieving at least age related standards in this subject
- To use Government funding to ensure children are developing their health and well being through greater participation in physical activity
- To improve opportunities for children who want to participate in competitive sport
- **To develop participation pathways including all pupils that transition into recreational activities**

### Summary of spending and actions taken:

#### Resources

*Audit of current resources.*

*Investigate resources to support development of physical literacy*

- Subscription to 5 a day TV
- Upgrade of the small sports equipment followed by training of School leaders to instigate and supervise playground games at lunchtimes

#### After school clubs for pupils

*Extend range of clubs on offer and the time of day they are on offer*

- Termly house matches
- Introduction of a yoga club
- Purchase of new school sports kit for competitions
- Coach hire to transport pupils to some events

#### Teacher CPD

*Ensure that staff have received training to teach all aspects of the National curriculum PE units*

- Teachers received gymnastics training and have also started training for the new REAL PE curriculum
- Bought into local coaching infrastructure

#### In School Provision

*Continue to use NS to support teachers and build up skills in a wider range of activities*

- Teachers provided with the opportunity to observe and teach alongside a coach
- Footiebugs have worked with KS1 staff to explore different approaches to teaching early PE skills
- New schemes researched and REAL PE selected
- Assessment in PE reviewed so that evidence is collected for children who excel in less mainstream sports

- 5 children represented the area at the Gala Finals
- Invited to the School Games finals to compete in a multi-sport event as we were one of the schools who had participated in the most competitions
