



<p>Numeracy</p> <p>As mathematicians we will study place value and numbers up to 10,000,000, developing written methods and problem solving. We will work with decimals and fractions, using the four rules and will know the order of operations. We will explore the properties of number through investigations of factors, multiples and prime numbers.</p> <p>We will be able to draw and name properties of shapes, including circles, and find missing angles.</p> <p>We will solve problems involving the calculation and conversion of units of measure.</p>	<p>Literacy</p> <p>As readers, we will explore classical poetry and texts and explore setting and characterisation. We will learn about Greek myths and gods; we will continue to read and analyse texts. Our class text will be Percy Jackson and the Lightning Thief.</p> <p>As writers we will learn how to develop our use of grammar and figurative language and will apply these skills to our work which will cover fiction, non-fiction and poetry.</p> <p>In our spoken work we will learn to interview characters and recite poems with expression.</p> <p>Our spellings will follow those set out in the new 2014 National Curriculum. We will explore how Greek words are used in our language.</p>	<p>Science</p> <p>As scientists we will investigate materials. We will learn about changes in state, irreversible and reversible changes, conductivity and magnets and electricity. We will know how to test different types of rocks and carry out investigations.</p> <p>We will read about famous Greek Scientists such as Archimedes.</p>	<p>History</p> <p>As historians we will explore Ancient Greek life in Athens and Sparta and compare historically and to modern Greece.</p> <p>We will examine the influence of Ancient Greece on our modern world today, such as the Olympics.</p> <p>We will learn about the Battle of Marathon and other significant events in Ancient Greece and know how to put them in chronological order.</p> <p>We will examine Ancient Greek culture which will include: art, food, worship and theatre.</p> <p>We will visit the Ashmolean to look at Ancient Greek artefacts.</p>
<p>Geography</p> <p>As geographers we will learn how to locate Greece using Google Earth and maps, and will find out about climate and geographical features. We will also consider why Greece is a popular place for tourism.</p>	<p>Music</p> <p>As musicians we will listen to and appraise classical pieces written about Ancient Greece: Henry Purcell's Dido and Aeneas and Offenbach, Orpheus in the Underworld.</p> <p>We will learn some songs about Ancient Greece and learn to sing and perform with excellence.</p>	<p>RE</p> <p>As Theologians we will learn about ways of worship. We will consider what fills us with wonder and symbols we use to feel close to our beliefs. We will learn about Holy communion and compare to the Sikh practice of Karah Parshad. We will learn about the Sikh way of worship.</p> <p>We will consider common themes for prayer and why they are chosen.</p> <p>We will remember those who have served the public on Remembrance Day.</p>	<p>PSHE/Citizenship</p> <p>We will explore friendship as our value and consider the fairness and the impact of bullying.</p> <p>The book "Wonder" will be used to support our learning.</p>
